
Dieter asked us to consider this question in relation to our own life and write down a concrete experience that exemplified it: In the following situation I felt that is was my responsibility to ... for the future.


Various examples were given and one chosen by a simple process of all of us voting for our top 3 choices.

At a public lecture I realised after the talk that only men were asking questions. Although I felt stressed and reluctant, I plucked up courage and asked a question. I did this because I wanted to encourage other women to take an active part - both in this situation and in shaping the future, so their views would be heard and respected. I felt this as a duty.

Dieter encouraged us to look at the story, and ask what has this got to do with the question? Can I personally agree with this? Can I relate to this story, could this be me?





The example principals we agreed on were:
To encourage more women to participate and articulate what they think to make a better - and not worse - future

The universal principles:

Every person counts

If I have a value I have a duty to act on it.

More equal participation is beneficial for all
